RE: MATHEMATICS MOCK EXAMINATION FEEDBACK

As a result of the recent Year 11 Mock Examinations your child has received personalised feedback on areas they need to focus upon to improve their grade in mathematics. Pinpoint Learning has analysed their mock exam papers and has highlighted the top fifteen topics, five per exam paper, which they need to work on prior to the next set of mock examinations; due to take place during week commencing 5th March 2018.

From the Pinpoint site each student will be given a hard copy of their three personalised homework booklets. Your child will be regularly assessed on the top fifteen topics in lessons to assess whether they have made an improvement towards securing the next grade.

In order to further aide their revision at home, your child has access to HegartyMaths. On the cover of the feedback homework booklets that your child receives will be a HegartyMaths code number relating to the tasks that will support them in securing the understanding of the topic required; for example: *101 Square and cube roots*.

To access HegartyMaths your child must go to www.hegartymaths.com and use the login details they created when setting up the account. If they have forgotten their login in details they can request their password to be reset from any mathematics teacher.

Once logged into HegartyMaths your child will be able to access videos on different topics at different grades. The videos will provide step by step instruction on how to solve problems and also give your child questions to answer. We advise your child to stop the videos at regular intervals to make notes which will support their learning and provide revision material for the topic. Revision notes can be made in their blue HegartyMaths homework books.

There is also a HegartyMaths app for smart phones which can be downloaded from the app store on Apple, Android and Windows phones.

I would ask you to support your son / daughter in achieving their GCSE maths target grade this year. You are aware that any student who fails to achieve grade 4 or better will be required to resit it in 6th form or at college.
